## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SHASTA RECOGNIZING AMY PENDERGAST, PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAM AND POLICY ANALYST OF THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES AGENCY, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AS APRIL 2017 EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH

**WHEREAS**, the Shasta County Board of Supervisors has adopted the Shasta County Employee Recognition Program to identify exceptional employees who deserve to be recognized and honored for their contribution to County service; and

She was responsible for writing the narrative for the infrastructure grant, collecting and tabulating the data, and coordinating conversations and decisions with other partners involved. Because of her strong relationship building, her proven expertise, and the respect given to her because of her professionalism, SCPW included innovative infrastructure into the design. Ultimately the proposal was recommended for funding.

Ms. Pendergast is always thinking of ways to improve the health of the community and prevent obesity and chronic diseases. Such as working with cities and the County by providing health language in the general plans to improve infrastructure to make it easier for people to walk or bike.
