**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF ANDERSON-COTTONWOOD IRRIGATION DISTRICT
ORDERING BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION;
CONSOLIDATION OF ELECTIONS; AND
SPECIFICATIONS OF THE ELECTION ORDER**

WHEREAS, California Elections Code requires a general district election be held in each district to choose a successor for each elective officer whose term will expire in December (December 2, 2022) following the election to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, other elections may be held in whole or in part of the territory of the district and it is to the advantage of the district to consolidate pursuant to Elections Code Section 10400; and

WHEREAS, elections code Section 10520 requires each district involved in a general election to reimburse the County for the actual costs incurred by the County Elections Official in conducting the election for that district; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code Section 13307(e) requires that before the nominating period opens the District Board must determine whether a charge shall be levied against each candidate submitting a candidate's statement to be sent to the voters; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code Section 12112 requires the election official of the principal county to publish a notice of the election once in a newspaper of general circulation in the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED that an election be held within the territory included in this district on the **8th day of November, 2022**, for the purpose of electing members to the Board of Directors of said district in accordance with the following specifications:

1. The election shall be held on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, 2022. The purpose of the election is to choose members of the Board for the following seats:

Division 1	December 2022-December 2026
Division 2	December 2022-December 2026
Division 5	December 2022-December 2026

2. The District has determined that the estimated cost for the optional Candidate Statement will be paid for by the:

Circle One: District Candidate

The Candidate's Statement will be limited to 200 words. The estimated cost shall be paid at the time of filing Declaration of Candidacy.

3. The District directs that the County Registrar of Voters of the principal county publish the Notice of Election in a newspaper of general circulation that is regularly circulated in the territory.
4. This Board hereby requests and consents to the consolidation of this election with other elections which may be held in whole or in part of the territory of the district, pursuant to Elections Code 10400.
5. The District will reimburse the County for the actual costs incurred by the County Elections Official in conducting the general district election upon receipt of a bill stating the amount due as determined by the elections official.
6. The Clerk of the Board is ordered to deliver copies of this Resolution to the Registrar of Voters.

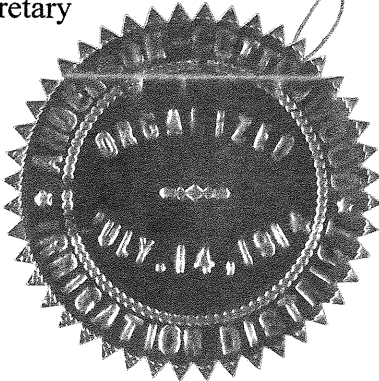

RESOLUTION NO. 22-35

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF ANDERSON
CALLING FOR A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Anderson has the need to call a General Municipal Election for the purpose of the election of two members of the City Council, each for a term of four years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to consolidate the general election with the statewide general election to be held on November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City of Anderson recognizes that additional costs will be incurred by the County by this consolidation and the City agrees to reimburse the County for actual costs pursuant to the election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ANDERSON DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to General Law Cities, there shall be, and there is hereby called and ordered, held in the City of Anderson, County of Shasta, on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, a regular General Municipal Election of the qualified electors for the purpose of electing two (2) members of the City Council each for the term of four (4) years.

Section 2. That pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code, the Shasta County Board of Supervisors is requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of the General Municipal Election with the Statewide General Election on November 8, 2022.

Section 3. That the Shasta County Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County Elections Office to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election for the City of Anderson.

Section 4. That each of the candidates will be required to pay the costs for the printing of his or her own candidate statement if the candidate wants such a statement to be included on the ballot.

Section 5. That the Shasta County Elections Department is authorized to canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used.

Section 6. That the City of Anderson recognizes certain costs will be incurred by the County by reason of these actions and agrees to reimburse the County for the reasonable costs incurred.

Section 7. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this

resolution with the Election Department of the County of Shasta.

Section 8. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.







RESOLUTION NO. BFPD 2022-05

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BURNEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, COUNTY OF SHASTA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SHASTA TO CONSOLIDATE A SPECIAL DISTRICT ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022, WITH THE ELECTION TO BE CONDUCTED BY THE COUNTY OF SHASTA ON THE SAME DATE AND TO RENDER SPECIFIED SERVICES TO THE DISTRICT PURSUANT TO SECTION 10403 OF THE CALIFORNIA ELECTIONS CODE

WHEREAS, pursuant to its rights and authority under State law, the Board of Directors of the Burney Fire Protection District (the "District") may call a Special Election to be held in the District on November 8, 2022, for the purpose of submitting a ballot measure to the voters of the District ("Special District Election"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority of Sections 13911 and 13913 of the California Health and Safety Code, and other applicable law, the District may levy a special tax on parcels of real property in the District for the purpose of providing rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services, subject to the approval by a two-thirds vote of the qualified voters of the District voting in an election on the issue; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its rights, powers and authority, on July 19, 2022, the Board of Directors of the District adopted Resolution No. 2022-04, calling a Special District Election to be held in the District on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, and ordering a measure to be submitted to the voters of the District at the Special District Election, as described in Section 3 hereof; and

WHEREAS, the County of Shasta ("County") will conduct its portion of a Statewide Election on November 8, 2022, in territory that is in part the same as the District; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the Special District Election be consolidated with the Statewide Election to be conducted by the County on November 8, 2022, and that within the District the precincts, polling places and election officers of the two elections be the same, and that the County Registrar of Voters canvass the returns of the Special District Election and that the consolidated election be held in all respects as if there were only one election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BURNEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct, incorporated herein by this reference, and made an operative part hereof.

SECTION 2. Pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the California Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County is hereby requested to consent and agree to the consolidation of the Special District Election with the Statewide election on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, for the purpose of submitting the measure set forth in Section 3 hereof to the voters of the District.

SECTION 3. The measure is to appear on the District Special Election ballot as follows:

<p>Burney Fire Protection District Rescue, Emergency Medical Care and Ambulance, Hazardous Material Emergency Response and Fire Protection Services Measure. To maintain and improve rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services, shall an ordinance be adopted authorizing an ongoing annual parcel tax on all nonexempt parcels within the District, based on land use, including a maximum rate of \$75 per single-family home, raising approximately \$237,994 annually, with audits and expenditure reports?</p>	<p>YES</p> <hr/>	<p>NO</p> <hr/>
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The full text of the ordinance to be submitted to the District voters, as contemplated by the ballot question, is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, and shall be printed on the voter pamphlet. The measure shall not take effect unless and until approved by a vote of at least two-thirds of the qualified voters voting on the question at the Special District Election.

SECTION 4. The District recognizes that additional costs will be incurred by the County by reason of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the County for any costs upon presentation of an invoice to the District. The District Secretary and/or Fire Chief are authorized to contract with the County to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment, personnel and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the District Special Election, at costs to be reimbursed by the District.

SECTION 5. Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 10403, the Board of Directors acknowledges that the consolidated election will be held and conducted in the manner prescribed in California Elections Code Section 10418. Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 10418, all proceedings incidental to and connected with the consolidated election shall be regulated and done in accordance with the provisions of law governing the Statewide Election. In all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the Special District Election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding district elections.

SECTION 6. Within the District, the election precincts, polling places and voting booths for the Special District Election and Statewide election shall, in every case, be the same and there shall be only one set of election officers in each of the precincts; provided that no person not a qualified elector of the District shall be permitted to vote for the measure placed on the ballot by the Board of Directors of the District.

SECTION 7. The County Board of Supervisors or County Registrar of Voters, as applicable, is authorized to canvass the returns of the Special District Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election and only one form of ballot shall be used. The ballots to be used at the election shall be in the form and content as required by law.


SECTION 8. The County Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County Registrar of Voters to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election and to County Counsel to prepare an impartial analysis of the measure set forth in Section 3 hereof, and to send this Resolution to the County Counsel.

SECTION 9. The District Administrative Assistant is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the County Board of Supervisors and the County Registrar of Voters of the County forthwith, and by July 26, 2022.

SECTION 10. The Chair of the Board of Directors shall sign and the District Administrative Assistant shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the official records of the District.



RESOLUTION NO. BFPD 2022-04

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BURNEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, COUNTY OF SHASTA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2022, AND ORDERING THAT A QUESTION RELATING TO THE LEVY OF A SPECIAL PARCEL TAX BE SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT THE SPECIAL ELECTION, AND MAKING A DETERMINATION OF EXEMPTION UNDER CEQA

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Burney Fire Protection District (“District”) provides rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services through the use of transport ambulances and fire suppression apparatus, fire stations, fire and emergency medical equipment, and necessary personal protective equipment and gear; and

WHEREAS, the provision of the rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services, including the provision of necessary personnel, the construction, acquisition, maintenance and replacement of necessary facilities, apparatus, equipment, gear, and vehicles, and related reserves are funded through ad valorem property taxes, grants, and fees for service; and

WHEREAS, due to increased costs, the ad valorem property taxes, grants, and fees do not provide revenues sufficient for the District to maintain and improve the current level of rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services, including the provision of necessary personnel, the construction, acquisition, maintenance and replacement of necessary facilities, apparatus, equipment, gear, and vehicles, and related reserves; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its rights and authority under State law, the Board of Directors may call a Special Election to be held in the District on November 8, 2022, for the purpose of submitting a ballot measure to the voters of the District (“Special District Election”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority of Sections 13911 and 13913 of the California Health and Safety Code, and other applicable law, the District may levy a special tax on parcels of real property in the District for the purpose of maintaining and improving the current level of rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services, subject to the approval by a two-thirds vote of the qualified voters of the District voting in an election on the issue; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors finds that the placement of the proposed measure on the ballot is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) pursuant to the State CEQA Guidelines Section 15060(c)(3), because the actions are not a project as defined by the CEQA Guidelines Section 15378 (b)(4). Adoption of the ordinance proposed by the ballot measure relates to the imposition of a parcel tax on parcels of real property in the District and

does not have the potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BURNEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct, incorporated herein by this reference, and made an operative part hereof.

SECTION 2. Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 13910, the Board of Directors hereby determines that the amount of revenue available to the District is inadequate to meet the costs of providing rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 13862 and deems it necessary and essential to submit a ballot measure regarding the levy of a special tax to the voters of the District at an election to be held on November 8, 2022.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to its rights, powers and authority, the Board of Directors of the District hereby calls a Special District Election to be held in the District on November 8, 2022, and orders the following question to be submitted to the voters at the Special District Election.

Burney Fire Protection District Rescue, Emergency Medical Care and Ambulance, Hazardous Material Emergency Response and Fire Protection Services Measure. To maintain and improve rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services, shall an ordinance be adopted authorizing an ongoing annual parcel tax on all nonexempt parcels within the District, based on land use, including a maximum rate of \$75 per single-family home, raising approximately \$237,994 annually, with audits and expenditure reports? 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SECTION 4. The full text of the ordinance to be submitted to the District voters, as contemplated by the ballot question in Section 3 of this Resolution is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, and shall be printed in the voter pamphlet.

SECTION 5. The ballots to be used at the election shall be in the form and content as required by law.



**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BURNEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT TO
AUTHORIZE THE LEVY OF A SPECIAL PARCEL TAX TO FINANCE RESCUE,
EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE AND AMBULANCE, HAZARDOUS MATERIAL
EMERGENCY RESPONSE, AND FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES AND
AUTHORIZING AN INCREASE IN THE APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR THE
BURNEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT**

**THE PEOPLE OF THE BURNEY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Authority, Purpose and Intent.

Pursuant to the authority of Sections 13911 and 13913 of the California Health and Safety Code, and other applicable law, there is hereby levied and assessed a special parcel tax by the Burney Fire Protection District (“District”) on all nonexempt parcels of real property in the Burney Fire Protection District for each fiscal year. It is the sole purpose and intent of this Ordinance to impose a special parcel tax for the specific purpose of maintaining and improving the current level of rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services, including providing the necessary personnel, the construction, acquisition, maintenance and replacement of necessary facilities, apparatus, equipment, gear, and vehicles, and any related reserves.

Section 2. Special Parcel Tax Imposed.

A special parcel tax for the purpose specified in Section 4 of this Ordinance shall be imposed on all nonexempt parcels of real property in the Burney Fire Protection District for each fiscal year (the period beginning July 1 and ending the following June 30), commencing with fiscal year 2023-24. The maximum amount of the special parcel tax for each fiscal year shall be based on the use of each parcel of taxable property in accordance with the schedule below:

	<u>Parcel Use Category</u>	<u>Total Annual Charge</u>
<u>A.</u>	<u>Vacant/Unimproved:</u>	<u>\$30 per year</u>
<u>B.</u>	<u>Single-Family Residential:</u>	<u>\$75 per year</u>
<u>C.</u>	<u>Rural Residential/Improved:</u>	<u>\$192 per year</u>
<u>D.</u>	<u>Multi-Family Residential (2-4 units):</u>	<u>\$309 per year</u>
<u>E.</u>	<u>Multi-Family Residential (5-9 units):</u>	<u>\$388 per year</u>
<u>F.</u>	<u>Multi-Family Residential (10+ units):</u>	<u>\$465 per year</u>

<u>G.</u>	<u>Commercial:</u>	<u>\$546 per year</u>
<u>H.</u>	<u>Industrial:</u>	<u>\$910 per year</u>
<u>I.</u>	<u>Retail (10,000 + square feet):</u>	<u>\$910 per year</u>
<u>J.</u>	<u>Mobile Home Site:</u>	<u>\$90 per year</u>

The records of the Shasta County Assessor as of January 1st of each year, or such other date established by the Fire Chief, shall be used to determine the land use category for each parcel for the calculation of the special parcel tax applicable to that parcel in the following fiscal year, with such corrections as deemed necessary.

For the purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

“Vacant/Unimproved” shall mean any vacant land or unimproved property.

“Single-Family Residential” shall mean a dwelling unit designed for occupancy by one household, located on a single parcel that does not contain any other dwelling unit (except an accessory dwelling unit, where permitted).

“Rural Residential/Improved” shall mean low density residential or agricultural structures that generally rely upon onsite water systems (wells), requiring the use of trucked-in water for fire suppression.

“Multi-Family Residential (2-4 units)” shall mean 2 to 4 dwelling units within a single building, or structures on a parcel. Types of multiple-unit dwellings include, but are not limited to, duplexes and apartments.

“Multi-Family Residential (5-9 units)” shall mean 5 to 9 dwelling units within a single building, or structures on a parcel. Types of multiple-unit dwellings include, but are not limited to, apartments.

“Multi-Family Residential (10+ units)” shall mean ten or more dwelling units within a single building, or structures on a parcel. Types of multiple-unit dwellings include, but are not limited to, apartments.

“Commercial” shall mean commercial or institutional uses including but not limited to stores and retail businesses (less than 10,000 square feet), offices, restaurants and bars, service stations, auto repair, hotels, motels, day care facilities, professional business parks, and similar uses.

“Industrial” shall mean industrial uses including but not limited to manufacturing, packaging, shipping, recycling, industrial parks, wood products, energy production, and similar uses.

“Retail (10,000 + square feet)” shall mean a retail business that occupies 10,000 or more square feet.

“Mobile Home Site” shall mean an area of land within a mobile home park that is rented, or held out for rent, to accommodate a mobile home used for human habitation. A mobile home park is an area of land where two or more mobile home sites are rented, or held out for rent, to accommodate mobile homes used for human habitation. A mobile home is a structure designed for human habitation and for being moved on a street or highway, including, but not limited to, manufactured homes, motor homes, and recreational vehicles.

“Parcel” shall mean a parcel of real property having a separate assessor’s parcel number as shown on the last equalized assessment roll of the County of Shasta.

Section 3. Annual levy.

The Board of Directors of the District shall annually, by an affirmative vote of at least a majority of its members, establish the amount of the special parcel tax levy, in an amount that does not exceed the maximum amount specified in Section 2 of this Ordinance. The special parcel tax shall not be measured by the value of property.

Section 4. Special Fund, Use of Tax Proceeds.

The proceeds of the special parcel tax imposed by this Ordinance shall be placed in a special fund, which shall be created and designated the Burney Fire Protection District Parcel Tax Special Fund, and shall be applied only for the purpose of providing rescue, emergency medical care and ambulance, hazardous material emergency response, and fire protection services, including providing the necessary personnel, the construction, acquisition, maintenance and replacement of necessary facilities, apparatus, equipment, gear, and vehicles, and any related reserves.

Section 5. Collection.

The special parcel tax imposed by this Ordinance shall be collected in the same manner, on the same dates, and shall be subject to the same penalties and interest as other charges and taxes fixed and collected by Shasta County on behalf of the District. The Shasta County Tax Collector may deduct reasonable administrative costs incurred in collecting the special parcel tax before remittance of the balance to the District. The special parcel tax, together with all penalties and interest thereon, shall constitute a lien upon the parcel upon which it is levied until it has been paid, and said special parcel tax, together with all penalties and interest thereon, shall, until paid, to the extent authorized by law, constitute a personal obligation to the District by the persons who own the parcel on the date the tax is due.

Section 6. Amendment and Implementation.

The Board of Directors of the District shall be empowered, by an affirmative vote of at least a majority of its members, to amend this Ordinance to carry out the general purposes of this Ordinance, to conform the provisions of this Ordinance to applicable state law or any paramount law, to modify the methods of collection, or to assign the duties of public officials under this Ordinance.

In no event shall the Board of Directors of the District amend this Ordinance to increase the maximum amount of the special parcel tax established in section 2 of this Ordinance, unless approved by two-thirds of the voters voting thereon.

The Board of Directors of the District, by resolution, may adopt procedures or definitions for the implementation or administration of the special parcel tax.

Section 7. Exemptions.

The special parcel tax shall not be imposed upon any parcel that is exempt from the special parcel tax pursuant to any provision of the United States Constitution, California Constitution, California State law, or any paramount law. The Board of Directors of the District, by resolution, may adopt additional exemptions to the special parcel tax imposed by this Ordinance.

Section 8. Appropriations Limit.

The appropriations limit of the District established under Article XIII B, Section 6 of the California Constitution shall be increased by the proceeds received from the special tax imposed by this Ordinance.

Section 9. Annual Report.

The District Fire Chief, as chief fiscal officer of the District, shall annually file with the Board of Directors of the District a report regarding the amount of special parcel tax revenues collected and expended and the status of any project required or authorized to be funded with the special parcel tax revenues, as required by California Government Code Section 50075.3, as such law may be amended from time to time.

Section 10. Independent Compliance Audit.

By no later than December 31 of each year, commencing on December 31, 2023, independent auditors shall review whether the tax revenues collected pursuant to this Ordinance are collected, managed and expended in accordance with the requirements of this Ordinance.

Section 11. Appeals.

The Board of Directors, by resolution, may establish an appeals process to address any errors in the amount of the special parcel tax assigned to a parcel.

Section 12. Severability.

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect any other provision or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. The Board of Directors of the District, and the electorate by referendum, do hereby declare that they would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, part or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, clauses, phrases, parts or portions thereof, be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 13. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall be adopted and become effective only if approved by two-thirds of the voters voting thereon, at an election to be held on November 8, 2022.


Section 14. Duration of Special Parcel Tax.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDDING CALLING FOR A MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE CONSOLIDATED WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022, SEEKING VOTER APPROVAL TO CONVERT THE OFFICES OF THE CITY CLERK AND CITY TREASURER TO APPOINTED OFFICES, SETTING DATES FOR THE SUBMISSION OF ARGUMENTS IN FAVOR OR AGAINST THE BALLOT MEASURE, AND REQUESTING THE ASSISTANCE OF THE COUNTY OF SHASTA IN CONNECTION WITH THAT ELECTION

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to submit to the voters of the City of Redding at a General Municipal Election to be consolidated with the Statewide General Election on November 8, 2022, a question relating to the City Clerk and City Treasurer positions; and

WHEREAS, State statute provides that the City Clerk and City Treasurer positions shall be elective; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 36508 also provides that the City Council may submit a measure to the voters asking if the City Clerk and City Treasurer positions should be appointive;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDDING DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City Council, pursuant to its right and authority, does call a General Municipal Election and orders submitted to the voters at the General Municipal Election to be held and consolidated with the Statewide General Election scheduled for Tuesday, November 8, 2022, the following question:

Shall the offices of City Clerk and City Treasurer be appointive?	Yes

A "yes" vote shall be counted in favor of having the positions become appointive. A "No" vote shall be counted against having the positions be appointive.

Section 2. That the proposed measure submitted to the voters shall read:

The people of the City of Redding do hereby request:

The City Clerk and City Treasurer shall no longer be elective officials of the City of Redding. From and after November 3, 2026, for the position of City Clerk, and from and after November 5, 2024, for the position of City Treasurer, or upon an earlier vacancy in the office of City Clerk or City Treasurer, the City Clerk and City Treasurer shall be appointed by the

City Council. The City Clerk and City Treasurer so appointed shall hold office at the pleasure of the City Council and, notwithstanding California Government Code Section 36502 to the contrary, are not required to be a resident or elector in the City. The City Council may by ordinance vest in the City Manager its authority to appoint the City Clerk and City Treasurer.

Section 3. Pursuant to Elections Code section 10403, the City Council requests the Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta to consolidate this City measure with the General Statewide Election to be held November 8, 2022.

Section 4. The City Council authorizes any and all members of the City Council (or anyone assigned by a Council Member) to file a written argument in favor or against the City measure, accompanied by the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the person(s) submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers, in accordance with Article 4, Chapter 3, Division 9 of the Elections Code of the State of California and to change the argument until and including the date fixed by the City Clerk after which no arguments for or against the City measure may be submitted to the City Clerk.

Section 5. Pursuant to Elections Code section 9286, the City Clerk has established Monday, July 18, 2022, 5:00 p.m. as the deadline for the submission of arguments in favor of and arguments against the question. If more than one argument for or more than one argument against the question is submitted, the priorities set forth in Elections Code section 9287 shall control.

Section 6. Pursuant to Elections Code section 9285 (b) the City Council hereby adopts the provisions of Elections Code section 9285 (a) allowing the filing of rebuttal arguments. The deadline for filing rebuttal arguments shall be Friday, July 29, 2022, 5:00 p.m.

Section 7. Pursuant to Elections Code section 9280, the City Clerk is instructed to transmit a copy of the ballot measure to the City Attorney along with a request that an impartial analysis be prepared for the ballot measure. The City Attorney shall transmit such impartial analysis to the City Clerk by 5:00 p.m., Monday, July 18, 2022.

Section 8. Pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to general law cities, there is called and ordered a general municipal election to be consolidated with the Statewide General Election held in the City of Redding on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, for the purpose of placing a measure to the voters of Redding relating to the elective nature of the City Clerk and City Treasurer positions.

Section 9. The City Clerk is authorized, instructed, and directed to work with the Shasta County Clerk and Registrar of Voters as needed in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election. The ballots to be used in the election shall be in form and content as required by law. The County is authorized to canvass the returns of the general municipal election.

Section 10. The Board of Supervisors is requested to instruct the Shasta County Clerk and Registrar of Voters to provide such services as may be necessary for the holding of the consolidated election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election. The City of Redding recognizes that the County will incur additional costs because of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the County for those costs.

2. Pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code, the Shasta County Board of Supervisors is requested to consent and agree to the consolidation election for the City of Shasta Lake; and
3. That the Shasta County Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instruction to the County Elections Office to take any steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election for the City; and

5. That each of the candidates will be required to pay the costs for the printing or electronic distribution of their own candidate statement if the candidates want such a statement to be included on the ballot.
