- 2. Nearest forest service land: Shasta-Trinity and Lassen National Forest
- 3. Statement of Project Purpose, Goals, and Objectives (maximum 5 lines):

The Shasta County Sheriff's Office is making application for Title III funds to assist in emergency fire response services. If awarded the funds will be used during fire response and or other natural or man-made emergencies on National Forest Service Lands. The funds will cover salaries, replacement of equipment, material/supplies, and repair of equipment damaged during the response.

4. Detailed Project Description (attach separate page if necessary)

The Shasta County Sheriff's Office, Office of Emergency Services, is one of the primary agencies to carry out emergency service activities on National Forest Service lands.

The Sheriff's Office is well trained in preparedness, response to, and recovery during emergencies. Some of these natural and man-made events happen on Forest Service lands. Our response teams to these natural or man-made events consist of full time deputies, non-sworn staff and volunteers. All members are well trained in the Incident Command System and if the response is extended due to the on-going emergency need the Sheriff's Office will activate its Overhead Team to manage our response.

This particular project will be dedicated to fire response for natural (lighting caused fires,) high wind events, avalanches etc.) or man-made events (arson) on Forest Service Lands which require an immediate response to rescue or evacuate citizens.

5. Explain how project meets the grant criteria and why (maximum 16 lines):

If the funds are awarded to the Sheriff's Office, it will be solely used for the purpose of response and recovery efforts on the National Forest. There is about 2.1 million acres on the Shasta-Trinity and about 1.2 million acres on the Lassen National Forrest. The funds will be specific for response on Forest Service lands in Shasta County.

6. How is this project in the best public interest (maximum 16 lines)?

Thousands of people visit our National Forest lands each year for a variety of reasons. In some instances those visiting and those living near Forest Service lands could need immediate life-saving response due to fires or any other hazardous incident. Having a well-trained and disciplined team instills public trust. Knowing that the Sheriff's Office is ready to respond at a moment's notice and dedicating its full capability could potentially mitigate any negative issues for the County, State and Federal Government.
