Shasta County Fire Department(SCFD) routinely assists federal agencies with wildland fire suppression throughout Shasta County. USFS Direct Protection Area surrounds much of SCFD's area of influence. Each year, SCFD provides mutual aid or assistance by hire under the California Fire Assistance Agreement (CFAA) on several wildland fires. Under the CFAA, the USFS only reimburses SCFD for personnel and equipment cost once they are committed for more than 12 hours. If SCFD equipment is released prior to the 12 hours, they do not receive any compensation for their services. SCFD is requesting \$29,750 to offset these operating and personnel costs during times of nonreimbursement. The reimbursement rates are based on the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CAL OES) reimbursement rates. SCFD provides a fire engine staffed with three firefighters and a water tender staffed with two firefighters, an estimated 15 times each year. During these occurrences, the fire is extinguished or contained and SCFD equipment is released prior to reaching the 12-hour reimbursable time frame. An extended commitment of two-twelve hours can create a financial hardship for volunteer firefighters. These reimbursement funds will help Shasta County Fire Department mitigate the out-of-pocket expense incurred by volunteer firefighter responses, and the operating cost of the fire apparatus.

5. Explain how project meets the grant criteria and why (maximum 16 lines):

SCFD expends funds annually to compensate firefighters assigned to fire suppression on USFS lands. SCFD is the primary responder to fire incidents at night or during non-fire season incidents on National Forest lands within Shasta County.

6. How is this project in the best public interest (maximum 16 lines)?

By funding this project, you are ensuring continued responses from volunteer fire apparatus on USFS wildland fires. In many cases, SCFD fire engines and water tenders are the first to arrive on emergency incidents on National Forest lands. Without a SCFD response to incidents within Forest Service DPA, wildland fires or other emergencies could go unstaffed for an extended period of time, increasing risk to the public and environment.
