**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
OF THE COUNTY OF SHASTA  
RECOGNIZING VENTON TROTTER, ASSOCIATE ENGINEER  
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS  
AS JANUARY 2017 EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, the Shasta County Board of Supervisors has adopted the Shasta County Employee Recognition Program to identify exceptional employees who deserve to be recognized and honored for their contribution to County service; and

**WHEREAS**, such recognition is given to the employee meeting the criteria of the program, namely exceptional customer service, professionalism, high ethical standards, initiative, innovation, teamwork, productivity, and service as a role model for other public employees; and

**WHEREAS**, the Shasta County Employee Recognition Committee has considered all current nominations for the Shasta County Employee of the Month;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that Venton Trotter, Associate Engineer, Department of Public Works is hereby named Shasta County Employee of the Month for January 2017; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that Venton Trotter's duties as a resident engineer require him to keep a positive and professional relationship with numerous project participants with different, and sometimes conflicting, interests. Mr. Trotter is able to communicate effectively and balance the concerns of all project participants. The closure of the Cassel-Fall River Road at Pit River Bridge was a contentious issue in the Intermountain Area. During the course of this project Mr. Trotter demonstrated his professionalism in the manner in which he worked with the local community, members of the Pit River Tribe, County road crews, and the contractor.

Mr. Trotter's vast knowledge of design, construction, and contract administration has helped the County avoid and/or solve problems on various projects. He often provides keen insight on best construction practices to deal with difficult problems. Before the Cassel-Fall River Road at Pit River Bridge was closed, the State required regular monitoring of the bridge to check for signs of settlement. Mr. Trotter devised a simple, yet effective, system to perform regular inspections of the bridge.
